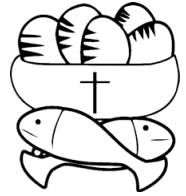

JUDICIAL VICAR – Canon Gargaro takes up his new role as Judicial Vicar of the Scottish Catholic Inter-Diocesan Tribunal on Wednesday of this week. The Tribunal is the Church's court in Scotland and principally deals with marriage annulments. The Judicial Vicar is responsible for managing the Tribunal (overseeing the recruitment, training, and work of staff and volunteers; managing the budget; reporting to the bishops and the Vatican; relating to other tribunals across the UK and beyond; etc.) as well as taking part in judging cases and interacting with the people involved in the cases. This is a nationwide role covering all the dioceses of Scotland. Up until recently this was a priest's full-time job, so it will be time consuming and may involve more absences from the parish and more time spent in the Archdiocesan Offices. Unfortunately, the falling number of priests mean that all priests end up doing a number of jobs that take time away from parish ministry or end up looking after a number of parishes – this is not something bishops or priests like doing, but there is no immediate alternative. Please pray for vocations to the priesthood, please pray for priests and be supportive of them, and please be understanding of the challenges that they face in trying to do alone what was previously done by many.

PARISH TRIP TO NATIONAL PILGRIMAGE AT CARFIN – Sunday 2nd September. Tickets will be on sale next weekend for just £5. When we did the trip to Largs we ran the bus without tickets, based on people just signing up at the back of the church and offering a donation on the day. Almost fifty people signed up, but only twenty turned up on the day, which was disappointing since we could have offered the spare seats to other parishes and allowed more people to attend. We hope that by selling tickets in advance this time we can get a more accurate idea of numbers.
