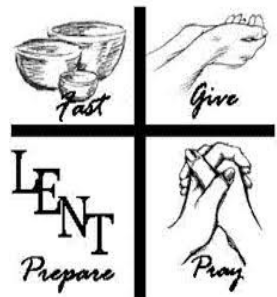
LENTEN TALKS -our series of Lenten Talks is off for the next couple of weeks.

FORTY HOURS – takes place here in St Patrick's from next Sunday, 11th, to Tuesday 13th March. On Monday 12th we have a Holy Hour and Benediction led by Br Darren Maslen SSS, a deacon preparing to be ordained a priest for the Blessed Sacrament Fathers; on Tuesday 13th we have a Holy Hour and Benediction led by Msgr Peter Magee, head of the Scottish Catholic Tribunal. Both services take place at 7pm.

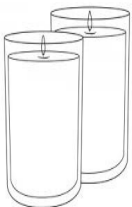
FORTCOMING COLLECTIONS: Next Sunday is **SCIAF Sunday** and the second collection will be to support the work of SCIAF.

DAY OF CONFESSION in the Cathedral – takes place on Thursday 22nd March with confessions from 7.45am to 5.45pm.

FREE PENSIONERS LUNCH – the Salvation Army in Houldsworth Street is offering a free lunch for local pensioners (all those 60+) on Monday 12th March at 12 noon. They have been in touch to encourage our parishioners to attend. They have also invited us to man a stall advertising St Patrick's and the work we do. Parishioners are welcome to attend the Mass too. The feast is also marked by a celebration of Mass in the Cathedral led by Archbishop Tartaglia at 1pm.
