Corpus Christi: this weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, remembering this wonderful gift that God has given us, the gift of Himself in Holy Communion. Let this feast remind us to make a special effort to be recollected in church, to greet Our Lord in the tabernacle as we enter and salute Him as we leave with a devout genuflection (if we are able to, otherwise with a bow), and to receive Him in Holy Communion with love, with suitable preparation, and with an unstained conscience, and afterwards to spend time in thanksgiving, so that we receive Him "with the purity, humility and devotion with which His most holy Mother received Him, with the spirit and fervour of the saints". To mark the feast there is Evening Prayer and Benediction on Sunday at 5pm.

Classrooms for Malawi: will be doing an appeal and asking for your support in the second collection next weekend, $8^{th}/9^{th}$ June. Please be generous in helping them.

First Friday: this Friday is the First Friday, and the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, so we will be joined by the Primary School for 9.30am Mass. June is the month of the Sacred Heart so we should make a special effort throughout June to reflect on Our Lord's infinite love for us as expressed by the image of His Heart. Let us keep praying "Sweet Heart of Jesus! We implore, Oh, make us love thee, more and more!"

Saturday Vigil Mass: we welcome Monsignor Paul Murray of St Peter's in Partick to celebrate the Vigil Mass this weekend. Canon Gargaro will be celebrating some Sunday night Masses in St Peter's in June and July (starting next Sunday), and so in return Monsignor Murray is celebrating our vigil this weekend.

RCIA: the new sessions of RCIA start shortly – if you are interested in discussing becoming a Catholic now is the time to speak to Canon Gargaro.
